Scavenger Hunt Reference Guide

(As defined by www.dictionary.com)

Simile- a figure of speech, using *like* or *as*, in which two unlike things are explicitly compared, as in: “She is *like* a rose.”

Hyperbole- A figure of speech in which exaggeration is used for emphasis or effect, as in: *I could sleep for a year* or *This book weighs a ton*.

Alliteration- The repetition of the same consonant sounds as in: “*Over the cobbles he clattered and clashed in the dark innyard.*”

Metaphor- The comparison of one thing to another without the use of *like* or *as* as in: “The road was a ribbon of moonlight.”

Personification- A figure of speech in which inanimate objects are given human qualities or are represented as possessing human form, as in: *Hunger sat shivering on the road* or *Flowers danced about the lawn*.

Onomatopoeia- A figure of speech where the word is imitating a sound as in: *buzz, clank, gargle, etc.*

Synonym- A word having the same or nearly the same meaning as another word or other words in a language. *Example: Happy is a synonym for joyous*

Antonym- A word opposite in meaning to another. *Example: Fast is an antonym for slow.*

Protagonist- The main or leading character in a literary work.

Antagonist- The opponent or enemy of the protagonist in a literary work.
